





1.1 SPORTING REGULATIONS

The Loton Park Championship is organised by the Hagley & District Light Car Club Ltd. in accordance with the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Championship Regulations.

1.2 SPECIFIC CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS

- 1.2.1 By registering for the Championship all competitors and their associates commit to positively promote and demonstrate the Motorsport UK's Respect Code which is appended to these regulations (Appendix 1).
- 1.2.2 Where any reports of disrespectful conduct are judged to be well founded the Championship organisers may issue warnings or require remedial actions and/or report the matter to the Championship Stewards who may impose appropriate penalties which can include loss of Championship points and/or race bans through to Championship Expulsion and referral to Motorsport UK.
- 1.2.3 It is imperative that we promote the safety and wellbeing of young people and adults at risk. In addition to this all participants must be aware of their behaviour and conduct at all times and abusive language and harmful behaviour will not be tolerated. Any such incidents must be reported to the Championship Coordinator and/or Safeguarding Officer who will also relay the report Motorsport UK. Details of the Motorsport UK Policies and Guidelines are available at www.motorsportuk.org/resource-centre by selecting Policies and Guidelines.
- 1.2.4 Due to both safety and environmental concerns, vehicles **must not** be left unattended under any circumstances when the engine is running.

1.4 COMPETITOR ELIGIBILITY

1.4.1 Drivers and Entrant/drivers must be fully paid up members of the Hagley & District Light Car Club Ltd., be registered for the Championship and be in possession of a valid Motorsport UK Interclub Competition Licence as a minimum.

A competitor shall not take time off school to participate in motor sport without the prior written approval of their school. If participation in the Championship requires absence from school, Drivers in full time school education are required to have the approval of their head teacher and a letter stating such approval from his/her school in order to fulfil registration for the Championship.

1.4.2 All necessary documentation must be available for checking at all rounds when signing-on.

1.5 REGISTRATION

1.5.1 Competitors must register for the Championship using the online official registration form on the Club website (www.hdlcc.com). Paper copies are also available on request by contacting the Championship Co-ordinator.

- 1.5.2 The registration fee for the Championship is £25.00.
- 1.5.3 To be eligible to score points in the Championship, all vehicles must display a minimum of two Championship decals which will be provided in accordance with the General Regulations H28.1.2 and H28.1.3 and comply with the Technical Regulations as defined in Section 3.
- 1.5.3.1 Entries for the Championship must be received at least 7 days prior to the round in which you intend to score points.

her first qualifying event to reflect the competitor's best time recorded during the season or at the discretion of the Championship Organiser.

- 1.7.1.2 Competitors in Class 1 will be given an initial Target Time based on their best practice time plus 8 seconds, whilst competitors in Classes 2 and 3, who competed in previous years in the same vehicle, will have their Target Times set from their best time recorded plus 8 seconds, or if a new car in Class 2, from their best practice time plus 8 seconds.
- 1.7.1.3 Target Times will be set by the Championship Organiser and may be reviewed by the Championship Stewards.
- 1.7.1.4 Competitors' scores are the margin of improvement over the Target Time expressed in seconds and hundredths of a second up to a maximum of 10.00 points.
- 1.7.1.5 Competitors may only score Loton Park
 Championship points in the LPC Class
 they have entered in the car originally entered or
 another car within the same Motorsport UK defined
 class.
- 1.7.1.6 In order to score points at an event, a
 Competitor <u>must</u> complete one
 competitive run. Practice times <u>will not</u>
 count, nor will they amend targets during
 the season.
- 1.7.1.7 The Loton FTD Championship will be based on the relative best times of each registered contender at each event and scored as follows:

Quickest Registered Driver, 15 Points Second Quickest Driver, 14 Points Third Quickest Driver, 13 Points

and so forth until

Fifteenth Quickest Driver, 1 point

- 1.7.2 Ties will be resolved on the basis of the number of maximum scores and, in the event of there still being a tie, the most number of second best scores etc.
- 1.7.3 Any appeal against the allocation of Championship points must be lodged in accordance with C6.5.1.

1.7 SCORING

1.7.1 Loton Park Championship contenders will be split into three classes as follows:

Class 1: Competitors new to competition in a car at Loton Park.

Class 2: Competitors who have previously competed at Loton Park, but do not qualify for Class 3.

Class 3: Competitors who have competed at Loton Park for 3 or more years in the same car with the exception of the 2020 season.

There will also be an FTD Championship, for which all registered entrants are eligible regardless of class.

1.7.1.1 Each Competitor will be given a Target Time prior to the competitive runs at his/

1.8 AWARDS

1.8.1 Awards will be decided by the total of a competitor's twelve best scores. If, for any reason, an event in Reg 1.6.1 cannot run or has been curtailed in that all Championship contenders are not equally affected, the Championship round for that event shall be cancelled. If this occurs, the number of scores to count for awards shall be reduced by one for each cancelled/ curtailed event.

1.8.2 At the conclusion of the Loton Park Championship, awards will be given as follows:

1st Overall: The Alfa Romeo Trophy and an award

1st, 2nd and 3rd in each Class: An Award (subject to a minimum of 8 entrants in Class)

The Loton FTD Championship awards will be:

1st Overall: The FTD Trophy and an award.

2nd Overall: An award 3rd Overall: An award

All awards will be presented at the Club's Annual Luncheon and perpetual awards remain the property of the Hagley & District Light Car Club Ltd.

4 ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERNS

5.2 Eligibility -

Drivers and Entrant/drivers must be fully paid up members of the Hagley & District Light Car Club Ltd., and be in possession of a valid Motorsport UK Interclub Competition Licence as a minimum. The Championship is open to all drivers of cars complying with the regulations for, and entered in classes 1a-e, 2, 3 a-d, 4, 5, 6 and E or at National meetings classes A i-iii, B, C i-iv, D, F and G.

5.3 The Top Ten Challenge is open to all drivers who are fully paid up members of HDLCC and whose cars comply with the regulations for the above classes. Drivers meeting these criteria will be automatically entered in the Top Ten Challenge unless they opt out prior to the

commencement of any round of the championship.

5.4 Qualifying - At each event after the completion of 2 class runs the 10 drivers who are eligible according to 5.2 & 5.3 and have recorded the best times against a target time will be offered a further run. The target time will be set before the meeting. This will be based on the class record time standing at the start of the meeting and at the discretion of the Championship organiser. The order of running will be determined by the class times relative to the target, the competitor with the best time relative to target starting last. If a car is shared then the slower of the drivers will run first and before the remainder of the top ten run off. If a driver qualifies for both the Titan-X Challenge run off and a National status run off at the same event then they will not be eligible to compete in the National run off & The Titan-X run off, if the competitor opts to run in the National run off in place of the Titan-X run off then their place will be taken by the next fastest qualifier.

Should there be a tie in times for qualification then the competitor with the faster of their other class run will be deemed to be the qualifier, if a tie remains then it will be the driver who set the qualifying time first.

Scoring - Times set in the Top Ten run off will score points on the basis of 10 points for first place down to 1 point for tenth place. Places will be determined by the time set relative to the competitors qualifying time, the competitor setting the best time relative to his qualifying time will be deemed to be first and so on to tenth place. Should there be a tie for a position during the run off then the points available for the tied positions will be awarded equally.

Times recorded in the Top Ten run off will not count towards the Loton Park Championship. Times set in the Top Ten run off will not be counted towards a competitors future target time.

Points scored in any eleven of the qualifying rounds will count towards the overall Championship score. Should any round(s) be cancelled then the number of qualifying rounds will be reduced by one for each round that is cancelled, see 1.8.1

5.6 Awards - The Top Ten Championship awards will be
